WHAT IS IN A NAME?

Many in the surrounding communities refer to our church as Reedsville. Our legal name is Bethesda. Bethesda was a pool of water in Jerusalem, symbolizing the healing power of Christ and the transformative nature of faith. An account from John 5 has Jesus healing a paralyzed man at this pool, highlighting His salvific and transformative power. As Christ followers, even in our imperfections, we are to allow Christ to use us as instruments of healing. Here are some thoughts about an identifying mark of Bethesda -- A Healing Community – put forth in an email from our Ministry Council President, Maggie:

"First and foremost: everything we do is Christ centered.We have such a desire to honor our Lord . . . especially our leadership . . . and we have . . .

- Church services conducive to all age groups: from 0 to 110
- Easy access to services easy to enter our campus buildings and via internet
- Prayer warriors who meet regularly, who cover services regularly, and who are in pockets or small groups praying for each other regularly
- Programs to not only come to know Jesus more intimately, but also each other: Spiritual Partners and Life Groups
- Programs to learn with others: Wednesday Bible Studies, Sunday School, BYM, and The Mountain
- Programs for specific types of healing: Celebrate Recovery and GriefShare
- A very robust (we step up) and generous (to others) benevolence program
- Programs to reach our friends and neighbors: via our Outreach Commission's various activities, Coffee @ The Corner, our Food Box Distribution, Food Pantry, VBS, OROC, and AHG

Bethesda is deliberate in its teaching: about the Trinity; about Jesus' sacrifice and glorious resurrection; about the importance of knowing Jesus personally and intimately; about the importance of Scriptures in our everyday lives; about healthy relationships – with the Lord, with one's self, and with others; about how to serve our Lord Jesus and each other with love and joy, patience and kindness; about God's character – love, righteous, fair, just, forgiving, and how we are created in His image!

We have reached out to our community through the Wayne Township Senior Center. We have no fear about rolling our sleeves up to help them seek growth because we know that all things are possible with the Lord."

Room 202 - International Room NIV Standard Lesson - "Worship in the Covenant Community"- by Jon Miller Facilitated by Steve Minnich

God's covenant—His enduring promise of relationship and presence—is central to the worship of His people. Worship is the act of ascribing worth to and celebrating the glory of something or someone. The truth is, all people worship. For the people of God, the question is, who will receive our worship? Is the triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit the only one we will choose to direct our worship toward? Scripture reveals a pattern to the worship of God's people: God reveals Himself, and His people respond through their worship. In the stories of Scripture, we read how they responded: they sang songs, raised their hands, played instruments, danced to music, and did good works of service. The lessons of this quarter examine the worship that God's people have offered. Although the ways His people worship may have changed throughout history, the reason for their worship remains the same: a faithful response to God.
