Room 202 - International Room NIV Standard Lesson - "Worship in the Covenant Community"- by Jon Miller

God's covenant—His enduring promise of relationship and presence—is central to the worship of His people. Worship is the act of ascribing worth to and celebrating the glory of something or someone. The truth is, all people worship. For the people of God, the question is, who will receive our worship? Is the triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit the only one we will choose to direct our worship toward? Scripture reveals a pattern to the worship of God's people: God reveals Himself, and His people respond through their worship. In the stories of Scripture, we read how they responded: they sang songs, raised their hands, played instruments, danced to music, and did good works of service. The lessons of this quarter examine the worship that God's people have offered. Although the ways His people worship may have changed throughout history, the reason for their worship remains the same: a faithful response to God.
