What is one way we can connect with others in the community? SPORTS! Beginning in January 2025, we will have the opportunity to do exactly this – through Upward Sports.

Highly recommended during the pastoral tenure of Dr. Phil Bolerjack, seeds were planted concerning an outreach ministry he was familiar with – Upward Sports. This seed has been cultivated and grown into an indoor soccer experience that will consist of two league levels: 2nd - 3rd grades and 4th - 5th grades.

Statistically, approximately 50% of those who attend Upward Sports ministries are unchurched. The goal of this indoor soccer season taking place from January – March: to make Jesus known through our actions, attitudes and words.








Wednesday Night Ministries Starting January 8th, from 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm




